| Brief description | This course provides an overview of the legal framework governing international economic relations and cross-border business activities. It introduces the core concepts, principles, and sources of international economic and business law, and examines the role of legal institutions and dispute settlement mechanisms at the global and regional levels. Particular attention is given to the practical application of legal rules affecting international business. |
