## **TEACHING LANGUAGE**

(autumn and spring semesters)

Most courses are taught in French. **Students' French language skills must be** *at least equivalent to level B2 of the CEFR*. Students who do not meet this requirement shall enrol in the courses of French as a foreign language (see below).

At Bachelor level, several courses are taught in English at the Faculty of Business and Economics and at the School of Biology. At Master level, programmes taught in English are offered in Geology, Environmental Geosciences, Business, Finance, Economics and English Literature. A PDF list of courses taught in English is available on our website. Students wishing to attend these courses must have sound academic skills, and English language skills at least equivalent to the level B2 of the CEFR.

It is recommended for students wishing to attend courses taught in English to have at least a basic knowledge of French for daily life and social integration.

## **INSURANCE**

Foreign students **must** have a health and accident insurance coverage that complies with Swiss regulations. If a foreign health and accident insurance does not offer the minimum coverage required by Swiss law, the exchange student will have to contract a Swiss health and accident insurance for international students. European students can benefit from the minimum coverage required by Swiss law if they have a European Health Insurance Card. More information

## **IMMIGRATION**

## Visa

Students should apply to the Swiss diplomatic representation in their own country in order to complete the necessary administrative procedure. It is very important that these formalities are started within the time limits set, i.e. 2 to 3 months before their arrival in Switzerland. Students coming from the countries of the European Union do not have to complete these formalities. **Important:** It is impossible to change a tourist visa into a student permit once the student has arrived in Switzerland. Thus, the exchange student must apply for a national visa (Visa D) designed for a stay of more than 90 days.

## Residence permit

Upon arrival in Switzerland, the student must go personally to the Foreign Registration Office (Bureau des étrangers) of his/her town of residence.
