Language Requirements	Courses at UZH are mainly held in German. Courses in English are offered in several fields of study. We recommend a minimum level of B2, as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), in the language of instruction. It is the responsibility of the partner universities to nominate students that have adequate language skills. However, we reserve the right to reject students if we perceive that they will not be able to successfully follow courses and exams. Students who intend to take courses in German or English Literature and Linguistics, and who are non-native speakers of the respective language, are expected to have a standard of proficiency at the level of C1 of the CEFR in the respective language. In philology courses the language of instruction is often the language of the region studied. The language of instruction can be found in the Course Catalogue.

Language Courses	Students can participate in an intensive German course for a fee of CHF 120.- that takes place two weeks before the beginning of the semester. Other language courses are offered during the semester, which cost between CHF 80.- and CHF 150.- depending on the chosen course and amount of weekly lessons. Application deadlines apply and places are limited. Information about the exact dates, duration and application deadlines will be available several weeks before the beginning of the semester at https://www.sprachenzentrum.uzh.ch/en.html
Transcript of Records	Students can download their official electronic transcript of records from their UZH Student Portal account approximately 8–10 weeks after the end of their exchange (mid-March for the fall semester and early October for the spring semester). In the meantime, they may use the overview available on the student portal as a provisional transcript of records, which is accessible earlier.
