Course description

The course discusses the different aspects of settling international commercial (business) disputes through arbitration. After having a basic introduction to the concept of international commercial arbitration, the students will study the main issues regarding arbitration agreements, arbitral procedures and arbitral awards. The course is intended to be practice oriented so it is centered around the practical aspects of arbitration focusing on the crucial questions. The course materials include compulsory readings, case law materials and practical cases. All course materials are available on the Moodle site of the course.
